Hillson, Since 1992, Hillson has directed his Mountaineers to nine PSAC East Division

Championships, three North Atlantic Regional

Championships and three trips to the Division II World Series. The 2008 Mountaineers finished 31-20, leading the PSAC in hitting at .336 and homeruns with 41.

During the 1990's the Mountaineers were the seventh winningest program in Division II, winning 71.1% of the games and ranked eighth in wins with 354. Now witih 714 victories Coach Hillson became the fastest coach in Division II history to reach the 700 win milestone.

A nationally recognized authority on hitting, Hillson's teams have ranked among the top five in Division II season-ending statistics nine times. Eighteen players have entered professional baseball in the last 21 years. Tyler Noel signed with the Texarkana Gunslingers in 2009. Ryan Giblin signed with Windy City in 2008. Former camper **Eric Baker** led Division II in hitting .500, and was drafted by the **Houston Astros** in the 27th round. Coach Hillson is known for his hitting, but 10 of the players signed have been pitchers, including: 2002 Montreal Expos Greg Martin, 1998 Boston Red Sox Chris Zallie, 1999 Houston Astro 11th round pick Kris Kann, and Milwaukee Brewers 15th round pick Chris McGee (all former campers). Twenty-two Mountaineers have been named All-American, the most of any Northern Division II school.






