The Mountaineers remain on the road as they travel to West Chester to face the Golden Rams in a PSAC East contest. Kickoff is scheduled for 1:00pm at John A. Farrell Stadium.

Last Weekend

Mansfield remained winless on the season after falling 42-6 to the #20 ranked Indians of IUP.

Rodney Davis led the Mountaineers with 233 all-purpose yards including 162 yards on the ground and an 80-yard touchdown run.

Andre Turner lef the defense with 9 total tackles while Josh Miller added eight. Greg Hopkins recorded an interception.

The Series

This contest marks the 35th time the Mountaineers have faced the Golden Rams on the gridiron with West Chester holding a perfect 34-0 record in the series.

Last Season, the Mountaineers fell 63-20 at West Chester when the Golden Rams racked up 563 yards of total offense.

Mountaineer quarterback John Hengehold threw for 160 yards and three touchdowns but was intercepted twice. Poohbear McNeal rushed for 76 yards.

The Coaches

Mansfield is directed by third-year head coach Jim Shiffer. The first alumnus to serve as head football coach at MU in 76-years, Shiffer was a standout offensive lineman in the late 1980s and had been an assistant coach at Yale, Pittsburgh, Millersville and Kutztown before returning to Mansfield. Shiffer is 2-26 overall in his tenure at MU.

Bill Zwaan is in his fourth season at the helm of the WCU program where he has seen success in the likes of a 33-14 overall record. He took the Golden Rams to the NCAA playoffs in 2005 after finishing second in the PSAC East. In his career, he has amassed an 87-28 overall record.

About The Mountaineers

Mansfield enters this week's contest at 0-8 overall and 0-4 in the PSAC East after last week's loss to IUP.

The Mountaineer offense continues to struggle this season, putting up only 54 points in eight games thus far and ranking 13th in the PSAC in total offense (187.4 ypg).

Mansfield has been outscored 316-54 in eight games this season.

After the Mountaineers adopted drastic changes to the starting offense last week, Rodney Davis proved he is ready to run. The sophomore compiled 233 all-purpose yards including 162 rushing yards, the most by a Mountaineer since the opening game of the 2005 season. Davis also broke an 80-yard TD run, the longest TD run since 1998 when Lee Brannon went 85 yards.

The quarteback situation also changed again last week as the Mounties started their fourth different quarterback of the season in freshman Xavier Thomas. Thomas threw the ball only six times, completing three passes for six yards.

The Mountaineer ground game produced a season high 175 yards last weekend, a high point for the struggling offense.

Turnovers remain a problem for the Mounties, who had two fumbles returned for touchdowns last weekend. After fumbling five time last week, the Mountaineers have turned the ball over 27 times this season, 12 lost fumbles and 15 interceptions.

The Mountaineer defense continues to struggle as well. Mansfield ranks 14th in the PSAC in scoring defense, allowing 39.5 points per game this season, 196 rushing yards per game (12th), and 205.5 passing yards per game (12th).

The senior leader of the defense continues to be Andre Turner. Turner has led the defense in tackles for the last six weeks and now leads the team on the season. He has racked up 73 stops including 33 solo, and has 1.0 sacks. He ranks third in the PSAC with 9.1 tackles per game.

Mike Gardier sits on the PSAC leaderboard with Turner at fourth in tackles with 9.1 per game. Gardier has wrapped up 73 tackles including 41 solo.

Josh Miller has been a bright spot on defense this season as well, ranking among the PSAC leaders. Miller has 48 tackles on the year including 6 tackles for a loss, 3 sacks, and one forced fumble.





Next Week

The Mountaineers return home for the final game of the season as they square off against Millersville University on Senior Day.

Kickoff is scheduled for 1:00pm.

About The Golden Rams

West Chester enters this contest with a perfect 34-0 record against the Mountaineers in the history of the two teams. The Golden Rams currently sit second in the PSAC East with a 6-3 overall record and a 4-1 conference mark.

The Golden Rams are led this season by a potent offense that ranks #1 in the PSAC in scoring, putting up 36.2 points per game.

Quarterback Bill Zwaan, a junior, is the leader of that offense. Zwaan was the PSAC East offensive player of the week last week, and was also the ECAC offensive player of the week, for his efforts last weekend in a 49-28 routing of East Stroudsburg. The junior QB completed 17-of-21 passes for 219 yards and four touchdowns.

The air attack is not the only powerful component of the Golden Ram offense. The ground game ranks third in the PSAC averaging 189.7 yards per game. Heading the charge is junior running back Osagie Osunde who sits fourth in the PSAC averaging 5.9 yards per carry and 74.6 yards per game. Brent Steinmetz is also ranked in the PSAC, sitting eighth on the board averaging 62.4 yards per game. Combined, the two backs have rushed for 15 touchdowns on the season.

WR Mike Washington ranks ninth in the PSAC in receptions per game with 4.44 but ranks second in receiving yards per game averaging 97.0. Last weekend, he became the fastest player in school history to reach 2,000 receiving yards. The sophomore sits 10th on the all-time WCU receiving list with 2,058.





Leys to the Game

The Golden Ram passing defense ranks last in the PSAC allowing 229.7 yards per game through the air... The Mountaineers will need to prove themselves in the passing game after throwing for just 23 yards combined in the last two weeks.

The WCU rush defense ranks sixth in the league, allowing 128.3 yards per game. If Davis can carry his momentum from last week into this weekend, he could have another breakout performance.

Turnovers have been crucial all season for the Mounties. West Chester has forced more turnovers than any other team in the PSAC, gaining 12 fumbles and 16 INT's on the year.
