This Weekend

The Mountaineers return home for the annual Homecoming weekend to square up against the Bald Eagles of Lock Haven University at 1:00pm at Karl Van Norman Field.

Last Weekend

Mansfield comes into this week after suffering a dissapointing 46-0 setback at Slippery Rock last weekend marking the first time in the last 49 years that Mansfield has been shut out in consecutive games to start the season.

Lock Haven enters this weekend off a shutout loss as well after Millersville defeated the Bald Eagles 35-0.

The young Mounaineer squad has faced difficulty on the offensive side of the ball in the first two games, failing to score. Senior quarterback Tyler Blakeslee made his first appearance of the season last weekend, completing his first collegiate pass and finishing 6-of-15 for 101 yards and two interceptions.

Freshman Michael Gardier has been a high point, recording 12 tackles in the game against SRU. Gardier leads the PSAC in tacles with 13.5 per game.

The Series

This contest marks the 66th time Mansfield and Lock Haven have met on the football field.

Lock Haven holds a 41-20-4 advantage over the previous meetings, including three of the last four contests.

The series has been close as of late, with three of the last four games being decided by less than 7 points.

Last season, Lock Haven defeated Mansfield 24-12 in the Bald Eagles homecoming contest.

The Coaches

Mansfield is directed by third-year head coach Jim Shiffer. The first alumnus to serve as head football coach at MU in 76-years, Shiffer was a standout offensive lineman in the late 1980s and had been an assistant coach at Yale, Pittsburgh, Millersville and Kutztown before returning to Mansfield. Shiffer is 2-21 overall in his tenure at MU.

John Klacik is now in his second year at the helm of the Bald Eagle program. Klacik is 2-12 overall as a head coach. Klacik was a standout receiver for Lock Haven, graduating in 1988. While there, he lead the Bald Eagles in receiving yards each of his four years. He ranks 10th all-time in career receiving yards with 1,976.





The Last Time

The last time Lock Haven and Mansfield met was October 1, 2005 at Lock Haven for their homecoming game.

LHU picked up a 24-12 victory in the contest after being led by the ground attack of John Kaluzny and Chelstan Anderson. Kaluzny carried the ball 39 times for 233 yards while Anderson ran for 145 yards and two touchdowns.

The Lock Haven passing game was held to only six competions for 28 yards.

Mansfield got touchdowns from Poohbear McNeal who rushed for 98 yards and Ozzie Mathis who caught five passes for 73 yards. John Hengehold was 18-of-30 for 262 yards and a touchdown.

About The Mountaineers

Mansfield enters this week's homecoming contest after suffering a dissapointing 46-0 setback last weekend at Slippery Rock.

The Mountaineers have struggled over the first two games of the season, failing to score any points. It marks the first time in 49 years that Mansfield was shut out in consecutive games to open the season.

The Mountaineers sit 14th in PSAC in scoring offense and 13th in total offense. Mansfield ranks 14th in passing offense and 12th in rushing offense.

Senior quarterback Tyler Blakeslee made his first appearance of the season last weekend, completing his first collegiate pass while settling in with the offense. Blakeslee threw for just over 100 yards and was intercepted once.

Freshman running back Tucker Berry turned in the best offensive performance last week carrying the ball 19 times for 85 yards. The young running attack of Berry and Calhoun will look for breakthrough performances against the 10th ranked rushing defense in the PSAC this weekend.

Defensively, the Mountaineers have struggled this season as well, allowing 81 points over two games. Mansfield ranks 13th in the PSAC in scoring defense and 14th in total defense. Lock Haven ranks 14th in scoring defense and 13th in total defense.

Freshman defensive back Michael Gardier continues to impress on the defensive side of the ball. Gardier led the Mountaineers in week one with 15 tackles and followed that performance by leading Mansfield again, this time with 12 stops at SRU.

Gardier leads the PSAC in tackles with 27, including 17 solo. His 13.5 tackles per game leads all PSAC defenders by over 3.0 tackles. Second on the board sits at 9.7 tpg.

The emotional leader of the defense continues to be Andre Turner. The senior linebacker ranks in the top 20 on the PSAC leaderboard averaging 7.0 tackles per game.

Joining Turner and Gardier on the leaderboad after two games are Tom Duer and Joshua Miller. Both Duer and Miller are averaging 6.5 tackles per game and Miller has recorded 1.0 sack this season.

Thomas Malinich and Greg Hopkins are each on the board with 5.5 tackles per game. Malinich also has 1.0 sack on the season.





Next Week

The Mountaineers return home for the annual 1890's weekend. It marks the opening of the PSAC East Schedule as Mansfield hosts the 2005 National Semi-Finalists from East Stroudsburg. Kickoff is scheduled for 1:00pm at Van Norman Field.

About The Rald Eagles

Lock Haven enters this weekend with an 0-3 overall record after suffering setbacks to Southern Illinois, East Stroudsburg, and a 35-0 blanking last weekend against Millersville.

The Bald Eagles have produced 14 total points this season and have been shut out twice. Lock Haven ranks 13th in scoring offense (4.7ppg) and 14th in total offense avaeraging just 156.0 yards per game. The Bald Eagle passing and rushing offenses both rank 13th in the conference.

First year quarterback Ilio DiPaolo had his best performance of the season last weekend at Millersville, completing 21-of-32 attempts for 164 yards, the first time this season the Bald Eagles have gone over 100 yards in the air.

Junior David Show leads the defensive attack this season for Lock Haven. Show ranks fifth in the PSAC in tackles averaging 8.7 stops per game. Corey Gildea joins him on the leaderboard averaging 7.3 tackles per game.

Senior linebacker Jonathan Nalewak is approaching a career milestone as he currently has 232 career tackles and needs 44 more to move into 10th all-time in Lock Haven history.

Lock Haven has won the last six games at Karl Van Norman Field.





Leys to the Game

The stage is set for what could be a high scoring contest or what could be a low scoring battle. Either way, the two teams are fairly evenly matched in terms of ranking within the PSAC, which could make for another close contest between the two rivals.

Mansfield is going to have to find away to convert the offensive production into points. The Mountaineers have failed to score this season, despite being in the redzone three times. They were intercepted twice and turned the ball over on downs on the one yard line.

Time of possession could be key as Mansfield has only possessed the ball 24:45 over two games, forcing the defense to spend immense amounts of time on the field.
